## BE LIKE MIKE



• **Mike Evans** has accumulated 1,000+ receiving yards in each of his first six NFL seasons, joining Pro Football Hall of Famer **Randy Moss** as the only players in league history to accomplish that feat.

• Among active pass-catchers, Mike Evans ranks third in yards per reception (min. 250 receptions).

• Since entering the league in 2014, Evans ranks tied for third in receiving touchdowns with 48.

## FIRST LOOK AT FOURNETTE

• On Sept. 6, the Tampa Bay Buccaneers signed fourth-year running back Leonard Fournette. The No. 4 overall selection in the 2017 NFL Draft comes to Tampa with two 1,000-yard rushing seasons already under his belt after just three years in the NFL.

• A season ago, Fournette rushed for a career-best 1,152 yards, which ranked sixth in the NFL. He is one of just 10 players with multiple 1,000-yard rushing seasons since entering the league in 2017.

## PREPARING FOR AN ENCORE



• A season ago, OLB **Shaquil Barrett** led the league with a franchise-best 19.5 sacks, breaking Pro Football Hall of Famer **Warren Sapp's** previous franchise record of 16.5 set in 2000.

• If Barrett can rack up 15.0-or-more sacks in

2020, he would become just the 11th player in NFL history to post consecutive seasons with at least 15.0 sacks.

• In 2018, the Buccaneers ranked 20th in defensive rush average and 24th in rushing yards allowed per game. Last season, Tampa Bay ranked first in the NFL in run defense, while facing Christian McCaffrey (twice), Saquon Barkley, Todd Gurley II, Alvin Kamara

(twice), Derrick Henry, Chris Carson, David Johnson, Leonard Fournette, Marlon Mack and the 49ers' second-ranked rushing attack.

## ROCK SOLID ROOKIE CAMPAIGN

• Cornerback **Sean Murphy-Bunting** led the Buccaneers with three interceptions in 2019, which were the most by a Tampa Bay rookie since 2008 and tied for the fourth-most by a rookie in team history.

• His 70-yard pick-six against the Detroit

Lions in Week 15 was the sixth-longest interception return by any player in 2019 and the longest by a Buccaneers player since Mason Foster returned a pick 85 yards for a touchdown vs. New Orleans on 9/15/13.

## PRECISION PASSING REQUIRED



• Following a second-half surge, that saw the Buccaneers defense improve from 23rd in the NFL (Weeks 1-9) to 8th over the final eight weeks of the season, the Buccaneers defense led the NFL with 57 passes defended in 2019.

• Over that final eight-week stretch, Carlton Davis III and Jamel Dean tied for the most passes defended in the league (13), along with Steelers CB Joe Haden. For the season, Davis finished second in the NFL (19) and Dean finished tied for fourth (17).

# WHAT TO WATCH FOR

## BUCCANEERS TEAM

- Quarterback **Tom Brady** and tight end **Rob Gronkowski** have connected for **78 touchdowns** in the regular season and need **1 more** to match Dan Marino and Mark Clayton (79) for the fourth-most touchdown connections in NFL history.

## TOM BRADY

- Brady has **541 regular season** passing touchdowns and needs **six** to tie Drew Brees (547 - active) for the most regular season passing touchdowns in NFL history. Including the postseason, Brady has thrown for 614 touchdowns, the most in NFL history (regular season and postseason combined).
- Brady has **219 regular season wins**, the second-most by a player in NFL history, trailing only Adam Vinatieri (221).
- Including the postseason, Brady is tied with Brett Favre (326) for the most games played by an NFL quarterback.
- Brady has **two career regular season games with at least six passing touchdowns** and needs **one more** such game to tie Peyton Manning (three) with the most such games in NFL history. Including the postseason, Brady has seven such games, tied with Ben Roethlisberger for the third-most in NFL history.
- Brady has **six career regular season games with at least five passing touchdowns** and needs **one more** such game to pass Dan Marino (six) and Roethlisberger (six) for the third-most such games in NFL history. Including the postseason, Brady is tied with Manning with three such games.
- Brady has **29 career regular season games with at least four passing touchdowns** and needs **six more** such games to pass Peyton Manning (35) for the second-most such games in NFL history. Including the postseason, Brady has 30 such games and need four more to tie Manning (34) for the second-most such games in NFL history.
- Brady has **92 career regular season games with at least 300 passing yards** and needs **one more** such game to tie Peyton Manning (93) for the second-most such games in NFL history. Including the postseason, Brady has 108 games with at least 300 passing yards, trailing only Drew Brees (128).

## SHAQUIL BARRETT

- Barrett recorded a **franchise-record 19.5 sacks** in 2019. **With 15.0 or more sacks** in 2020, he would be just the 11th player in NFL history to post consecutive seasons with at least 15.0 sacks.
- Barrett has **19.5 sacks as a Buccaneer**. He needs **6.5 more** to tie Greg Spies (26.0 from 2002-07) for 10th-most, **7.0 more** to tie Broderick Thomas (26.5 from 1989-93) for ninth-most, **8.5 more** to tie Rondé Barber (28.0 from 1997-2012) for eighth-most, **13.5 more** to tie Brad Culpepper (33.0 from 1994-99) for seventh-most and **15.0 more** to tie Chidi Ahanotu (34.5 from 1993-2000, 2004) for the sixth-most sacks in franchise history.



## CAMERON BRATE

- Brate has **27 career touchdown catches**. He needs **one more** to pass Mark Carrier (27 from 1987-92) and tie Joey Galloway (28 from 2004-08) for the fourth-most touchdown receptions in team history.
- Brate has **three career games with multiple touchdown receptions**. He needs **one more** to tie Jimmie Giles for the most ever such games by a Buccaneers tight end and tie for the third-most such games in franchise history.

## LAVONTE DAVID

- David has **22.5 career sacks**. He needs **3.5 more** to tie Greg Spies (26.0 from 2002-07) for 10th-most and **4.0 more** to pass Broderick Thomas (26.5 from 1989-93) for the ninth-most sacks in franchise history. Thomas holds the record for the most sacks by a linebacker in franchise history.
- David has **1,006 career tackles** and needs **22 more** to tie Hardy Nickerson for the third-most in franchise history (1,028).
- David has **three career defensive touchdowns** and needs **one more** to tie for the third-most in franchise history (David Logan, 1979-96; Mike Washington, 1976-84).







# WHAT TO WATCH FOR

## MIKE EVANS

- Evans has **surpassed 1,000 receiving yards in each of his first six seasons** and, with **1,000 or more receiving yards in 2020**, will become the only player in NFL history to record 1,000 or more receiving yards in each of their first seven seasons. Evans would extend his team record for 1,000-yard receiving seasons and consecutive 1,000 yard receiving seasons. He would tie Lance Alworth (1963-69), Brandon Marshall (2007-13), Jimmy Smith (1996-2002) and Reggie Wayne (2004-10) for the sixth-longest streak of 1,000-yard receiving seasons.

## CHRIS GODWIN

- Godwin has **2,700 career receiving yards**. He needs **248 more** to pass Mike Williams (2,947 from 2010-13) for 10th-most receiving yards in franchise history.
- Godwin has **17 career touchdown receptions**. He needs **three more** to tie Vincent Jackson (20 from 2012-16) for 10th-most receiving touchdowns in Buccaneers history.
- Godwin had **1,333 receiving yards in 2019**. If he **surpasses 1,300 yards receiving in 2020**, he would be the first player in team history to record 1,300-or-more yards in consecutive seasons.

## ROB GRONKOWSKI

- Gronkowski has **7,861 regular season receiving yards** and needs **23 more** to pass Jimmy Graham (7,883 - active) for the fifth-most receiving yards by a tight end in NFL history. Including the postseason, Gronkowski has **9,024 receiving yards** and needs **52 more** to pass Greg Olson (9,075 - active) for the fourth-most receiving yards by a tight end in NFL history (regular season and postseason combined).
- Gronkowski has **79 regular season receiving touchdowns**. He needs **one more** to pass Harold Carmichael (79) and Charley Taylor (79) for 27th-most, **two more** to tie Art Powell and Steve Smith (81) for 25th-most and **three more** to tie Anquan Boldin and Reggie Wayne (82) for the 23rd-most touchdown receptions in NFL history. Including the postseason, Gronkowski has **91 receiving touchdowns** and needs **one more** to pass Reggie Wayne (91) for the 14th-most receiving touchdowns in NFL history (regular season and postseason combined).
- Gronkowski has **602 career receptions** (regular season and postseason combined) and needs **eight more** to tie Vernon Davis (610) for the seventh-most receptions by a tight end in NFL history.



## LESEAN MCCOY

- McCoy has **11,071 career rushing yards**. He needs **166 more** to pass O.J. Simpson (11,236) for 21st-most and **171 more** to pass Corey Dillon (11,241) for the 20th-most regular season rushing yards in NFL history.
- McCoy has **73 career rushing touchdowns**. He needs **one more** to tie Earl Campbell and Leroy Kelly (74) for 26th-most, **two more** to tie Clinton Portis (75) for 25th-most and **three more** to tie Pete Johnson (76) for the 24th-most regular season rushing touchdowns in NFL history.
- McCoy has **14,868 career yards from scrimmage**. He needs **24 more** to pass Ricky Watters (14,891) for 26th-most, **244 more** to pass Jerome Bettis (15,111) for 25th-most, **250 more** to pass Steve Smith (15,118) for 24th-most, **253 more** to pass Steven Jackson (15,121) for 23rd-most, **256 more** to pass Tim Brown (15,124) for 22nd-most and **274 more** to pass Tony Gonzalez (15,141) for the 21st-most regular season yards from scrimmage in NFL history.

## JASON PIERRE-PAUL

- Pierre-Paul has **21.0 sacks** as a Buccaneer. He needs **5.0 more** to tie Greg Spies (26.0 from 2002-07) for 10th-most and **5.5 more** to tie Broderick Thomas (26.5 from 1989-93) for ninth-most in franchise history.

# HC BRUCE ARIANS

## CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- X Arians is a two-time Associated Press NFL Coach of the Year, earning the award in 2012 (Indianapolis Colts) and in 2014 (Arizona Cardinals).
- X He is the only coach in NFL history to earn the award multiple times in a three-year span with different teams and is one of only 12 coaches in NFL history to win the award multiple times.
- X Prior to his time with the Colts, Arians spent eight seasons with the Steelers, five as offensive coordinator (2007-11) and three as the wide receivers coach (2004-06). During his tenure as the offensive coordinator, the Steelers had a 55-25 record, tying Green Bay for the second-best mark in the NFL during that span.
- X Pittsburgh won three AFC North Division titles, two AFC Championships and earned a victory in Super Bowl XLIII over the Cardinals. Arians was also part of the Steelers' Super Bowl XL win as the team's wide receivers coach.

## ARIZONA CARDINALS

- X During his time in Arizona, Arians compiled a 49-30-1 regular season record (.619 winning percentage). The Cardinals' 49 wins during that span were the seventh-most in the NFL and the third-most in the NFC. Arians won 50 total games in Arizona (49 regular season, one postseason), finishing as the winningest coach in franchise history. His 49 regular season wins are also the most by any coach in Cardinals history.
- X In 2015, Arians led the Cardinals to a franchise record 13 wins, which also featured the team's first-ever postseason bye and second-ever appearance in the NFC Championship Game.
- X Under Arians, the Cardinals offense set several single-season team records, including points scored (489 in 2015), total touchdowns (59 in 2015), total net yards (6,533 in 2015) and first downs (373 in 2015).

## TAMPA BAY BUCCANEERS

- X Bruce Arians was named the 12th head coach in franchise history on January 8, 2019.
- X In his first season with the Buccaneers in 2019, Arians led Tampa Bay to a two-win improvement over the previous season, guiding the team to a 5-3 record over the last eight games to finish 7-9. The team's seven wins were its most since 2016. In addition, the Buccaneers 5-3 record on the road matched the third-best road mark in team history.
- X Under Arians' direction, Tampa Bay's offense set franchise records for both points scored (458) and touchdowns (54), while leading the league in passing offense at 302.8 yards per game and ranking third in the NFL in total offense at 397.9 yards per game. On the defensive side of the ball, the Buccaneers boasted the NFL's best run defense, limiting opponents to 1,181 rushing yards over 16 games (73.8 avg.), the lowest total allowed in a 16-game season in franchise history.

## INDIANAPOLIS COLTS

- X Arians went to Arizona after spending the 2012 season with Indianapolis. Hired as the team's offensive coordinator, he also served as the team's interim head coach for 12 games while head coach Chuck Pagano was treated for leukemia. He led the Colts to a 9-3 record and was selected as the 2012 AP NFL Coach of the Year. Indianapolis' nine-win improvement (2-14 to 11-5) matched the third-largest single-season turnaround in NFL history.
- X Arians helped the Colts' offense rank 10th in the NFL in yards (362.4 ypg) and seventh in passing yards (258.0 ypg). Rookie quarterback Andrew Luck - the first overall pick in the 2012 NFL Draft - made the Pro Bowl and set rookie records for passing yards (4,374) and 300-yard passing games (six). He also established the NFL single-game rookie record for passing yards (433, 11/4 vs. Miami). Luck finished with the then-third-most passing touchdowns by a rookie in NFL history, with 23.

# SEAN PAYTON



Since he was hired as head coach of the New Orleans Saints in 2006, Sean Payton has established himself as one of the most successful coaches in the NFL. Since coming to New Orleans, Payton has led the Saints to eight playoff berths, six NFC South division titles and the franchise's first World Championship with a 31-17 win over the Indianapolis Colts in Super Bowl XLIV.

Entering 2019, Payton's 139 combined regular season and postseason wins in his NFL head coaching career rank 26th-most in NFL history. Payton holds the club's top win total and winning percentage for a head coach.

Payton has presided over the NFL's most prolific offense since his arrival, leading the league in net yards per game in 2006, 2008, 2009, 2011, 2014 and 2016 and finishing first in scoring in 2008 and 2009.

Despite missing QB Drew Brees for five contests, the 2019 Saints won 13 games, including seven on the road, both for the second consecutive season and captured the NFC South division title for the third straight time.

Payton was hired as the 14th head coach in Saints history on Jan. 18, 2006 after serving as a member of the Dallas Cowboys coaching staff from 2003-05 under 2013 Pro Football Hall of Fame inductee Bill Parcells. Prior to his final season with the Cowboys, Payton was promoted to assistant head coach/passing game coordinator and was responsible for the team's play-calling after serving as assistant head coach/quarterbacks from 2003-04.

Payton went to Dallas following four years with the New York Giants (1999-2002), the last three as offensive coordinator after spending his first season as quarterbacks coach.

Payton wrapped two coaching stints at San Diego State University (1988-89 and 1992-93) around a stop at Indiana State (1990-91). During his second stretch with the Aztecs, Payton was running backs coach, working with Heisman Trophy runner-up Marshall Faulk before becoming quarterbacks coach.

Following the 1993 season, Payton moved to Miami (Ohio) (1994-95) where he was quarterbacks coach. He spent 1996 as quarterbacks coach at Illinois before entering the NFL with Philadelphia.

Payton earned a bachelor's degree in communications at Eastern Illinois, where as a quarterback he had 10,665 passing yards, then the third-highest total in NCAA Division I-AA history. The three-time AP All-American selection had professional stints with Chicago of the Arena Football League, Ottawa of the Canadian Football League and the Chicago Bears in 1987. Payton was inducted into the Eastern Illinois Hall of Fame in September of 2000. He received an honorary doctorate from his alma mater in 2013.

Payton was born Dec. 29, 1963 in San Mateo, Calif., and raised in Naperville, Ill., Payton has a daughter, Meghan and a son, Connor.

Families should not have to worry about the safety of their children because of the color of their skin. Change for the black community must happen now and we must lead by our collective actions.

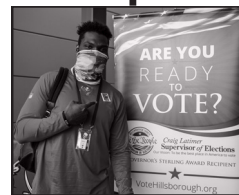
