• **Mike Evans** has accumulated 1,000+ receiving yards in each of his first six NFL seasons, joining Pro Football Hall of Famer **Randy Moss** as the only players in league history to accomplish that feat.

• Among active pass-catchers, Mike Evans ranks third in yards per reception (min. 250 receptions).

• Since entering the league in 2014, Evans ranks tied for second in receiving touchdowns with 53.

GETTING RED ZONE RESULTS



• The Buccaneers offense has scored a touchdown on 12-of-15 trips inside the red zone this season, while scoring at least a field goal on all 15 of its red zone drives.

• The team has found success through the air in the red zone, recording nine red zone receiving touchdowns, tied for the second-most in the NFL.

IT'S MILLER TIME

• In Week 1 vs. New Orleans, second-year receiver **Scotty Miller** hauled in five receptions for 73 yards, setting a career high for receptions.

• In Week 3 vs. Denver, the Bowling Green product set a new career high with 83 receiving yards, topping his previous high set in Week 1. He matched it again in Week 4 vs. the Chargers.

• Miller ranks fourth among members of the 2019 draft class in yards per reception (min. 25 receptions) and first among players drafted after the third round.

• Outside linebacker **Jason Pierre-Paul** recorded sacks in three of the first four weeks of the 2020 season, taking his career total to 82.5.

• Pierre-Paul has earned 24.0 sacks since joining the Buccaneers in 2018, which tie for the ninth-most in the NFL during that span.



ROUGHING UP THE RUN GAME



• In 2018, the Buccaneers ranked 20th in defensive rush average and 24th in rushing yards allowed per game. Last season, Tampa Bay ranked first in the NFL in run defense, and it continues to lead the NFL in that category dating back to the start of 2019.

THERE'S A LOT TO LIKE ABOUT LAVONTE

NFC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE MONTH

• Inside linebacker **Lavonte David** earned NFC Defensive Player of the Month Honors for September after posting a well-rounded statline, which included 24 tackles (two for loss), two passes defended, one interception, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery.

• Through Week 4, David leads the team in solo tackles (26) and ranks tied for first in both forced fumbles (one) and fumble recoveries (one), second on the team in tackles (35), tied for second in interceptions (one) and tied for third in tackles for loss (three).

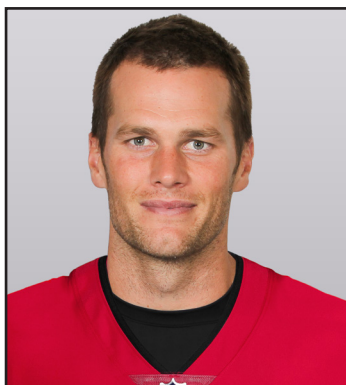

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

BUCCANEERS TEAM

- Quarterback **Tom Brady** and tight end **Rob Gronkowski** have connected for **78 touchdowns** in the regular season and need **1 more** to match Dan Marino and Mark Clayton (79) for the fourth-most touchdown connections in NFL history.
- Tampa Bay has registered at least one interception in each of the past three contests. With at least **one interception** at Chicago, it would mark the first time since 2016 that the team has recorded an interception in four consecutive games (11/13/16 vs. Chicago-12/11/16 vs. New Orleans).
- The Buccaneers held each of their past two opponents under 50 rushing yards, matching a franchise record. If Tampa Bay **holds Chicago under 50 rushing yards**, it will mark the longest streak of such games in team history.
- Dating back to the 2019 season, the Buccaneers have held 10 consecutive opponents under 100 rushing yards, establishing a franchise record. If Tampa Bay **holds the Bears under 100 rushing yards**, the team will establish a new franchise record. The 2014 Detroit Lions is the last NFL team to hold at least 11 consecutive opponents under 100 rushing yards (11 games, 10/5/14-12/21/14). Tampa Bay has 12.0 sacks this season.
- With **a win** at Chicago, the Buccaneers would be 4-1 for the first time since 2005.

SHAQUIL BARRETT

- Barrett recorded a **franchise-record 19.5 sacks** in 2019. **With 15.0 or more sacks** in 2020, he would be just the 11th player in NFL history to post consecutive seasons with at least 15.0 sacks.
- Barrett has **22.5 sacks as a Buccaneer**. He needs **3.5 more** to tie Greg Spires (26.0 from 2002-07) for 10th-most sacks in franchise history.



TOM BRADY

- Against L.A. Chargers, Brady threw five touchdown passes. With **five or more touchdown passes** vs. Chicago, it would mark only the sixth time in NFL history that a player has thrown for at least five touchdowns in consecutive contests. Brady has done so once before (10/14/07-10/21/07) and would be the first player to accomplish the feat more than once. The most recent player to do so was Russell Wilson (9/20/20-9/27/20).
- Brady has 11 passing touchdowns, tied for the most through four games in franchise history. He needs **one passing touchdown** at Chicago to tie Brad Johnson (12 in 2003) for the most through five games in franchise history.
- Brady threw for 369 yards against the Chargers. With at least **350 passing yards** against Chicago, he will join Ryan Fitzpatrick (franchise record three consecutive games) and Jameis Winston (four times) as the only players in team history to throw for at least 350 yards in consecutive games.
- Brady has 1,122 passing yards this season. With **250 passing yards** against Chicago he can pass Jameis Winston (1,371 in 2019) for the most passing yards through five games in team history.
- Brady has 552 regular season passing touchdowns and needs **three** to tie Drew Brees (555 - active) for the most regular season passing touchdowns in NFL history. Including the postseason, Brady has thrown for 625 touchdowns, the most in NFL history. Brady has 221 regular season wins, tied for the most by a player in NFL history, (also Adam Vinatieri, 221).
- Brady has two career regular season games with at least **six passing touchdowns** and needs **one more** such game to tie Peyton Manning (three) for the most such games in NFL history. Including the postseason, Brady has seven such games, tied with Ben Roethlisberger for the third-most in NFL history.
- Brady has 93 career regular season games with at least **300 passing yards** and needs one more such game to pass Peyton Manning (93) for the second-most such games in NFL history. Including the postseason, Brady has 109 games with at least 300 passing yards, trailing only Drew Brees (129).



WHAT TO WATCH FOR

CAMERON BRATE

- Brate has **28 career touchdown catches**. He needs **one more** to pass Joey Galloway (28 from 2004-08) for the fourth-most touchdown receptions in team history.
- Brate has **three career games with multiple touchdown receptions**. He needs **one more** to tie Jimmie Giles for the most ever such games by a Buccaneers tight end and tie for the third-most such games in franchise history.

LAVONTE DAVID

- David has **22.5 career sacks**. He needs **3.5 more** to tie Greg Spires (26.0 from 2002-07) for 10th-most and **4.0 more** to pass Broderick Thomas (26.5 from 1989-93) for the ninth-most sacks in franchise history. Thomas holds the record for the most sacks by a linebacker in franchise history.
- David has **three career defensive touchdowns** and needs **one more** to tie for the third-most in franchise history (David Logan, 1979-96; Mike Washington, 1976-84).



MIKE EVANS

- Evans has five receiving touchdowns this season. With **a receiving touchdown** at Chicago, he will match Chris Godwin (six in 2019) for the most receiving touchdowns through five games in franchise history.

RONALD JONES II

- Jones ran for 111 yards against L.A. Chargers. With at least **100 rushing yards** at Chicago, he will be the first Buccaneers player to post consecutive 100-yard games (10/10/16 at Carolina-10/23/16 at San Francisco).



CHRIS GODWIN

- Godwin has **2,843 career receiving yards**. He needs **105 more** to pass Mike Williams (2,947 from 2010-13) for 10th-most receiving yards in franchise history.
- Godwin has **18 career touchdown receptions**. He needs **two more** to tie Vincent Jackson (20 from 2012-16) for 10th-most receiving touchdowns in Buccaneers history.
- Godwin had **1,333 receiving yards in 2019**. If he **surpasses 1,300 yards receiving in 2020**, he would be the first player in team history to record 1,300-or-more yards in consecutive seasons.

ROB GRONKOWSKI

- Gronkowski has **7,949 regular season receiving yards** and needs **32 more** to pass Ozzie Newsome (7,980) for the seventh-most receiving yards by a tight end in NFL history. Including the postseason, Gronkowski has **9,112 receiving yards** and needs **53 more** to pass Greg Olson (9,195 - active) for the fifth-most receiving yards by a tight end in NFL history (regular season and postseason combined).
- Gronkowski has **79 regular season receiving touchdowns**. He needs **one more** to pass Harold Carmichael (79) and Charley Taylor (79) for 27th-most, **two more** to tie Art Powell and Steve Smith (81) for 25th-most and **three more** to tie Anquan Boldin and Reggie Wayne (82) for the 23rd-most touchdown receptions in NFL history. Including the postseason, Gronkowski has **91 receiving touchdowns** and needs **one more** to pass Reggie Wayne (91) for the 14th-most receiving touchdowns in NFL history (regular season and postseason combined).
- Gronkowski has **605 career receptions** (regular season and postseason combined) and needs **five more** to tie Vernon Davis (610) for the seventh-most receptions by a tight end in NFL history.



WHAT TO WATCH FOR

LESEAN MCCOY

- McCoy has **11,069 career rushing yards**. He needs **168 more** to pass O.J. Simpson (11,236) for 21st-most and **172 more** to pass Corey Dillon (11,241) for the 20th-most regular season rushing yards in NFL history.
- McCoy has **73 career rushing touchdowns**. He needs **one more** to tie Earl Campbell and Leroy Kelly (74) for 26th-most, **two more** to tie Clinton Portis (75) for 25th-most and **three more** to tie Pete Johnson (76) for the 24th-most regular season rushing touchdowns in NFL history.
- McCoy has **14,921 career yards from scrimmage**. He needs **189 more** to pass Jerome Bettis (15,111) for 25th-most, **196 more** to pass Steve Smith (15,118) for 24th-most, **199 more** to pass Steven Jackson (15,121) for 23rd-most, **202 more** to pass Tim Brown (15,124) for 22nd-most and **219 more** to pass Tony Gonzalez (15,141) for the 21st-most regular season yards from scrimmage in NFL history.



JASON PIERRE-PAUL

- Pierre-Paul has **23.0 sacks** as a Buccaneer. He needs **3.0 more** to tie Greg Spires (26.0 from 2002-07) for 10th-most and **3.5 more** to tie Broderick Thomas (26.5 from 1989-93) for ninth-most in franchise history.

Buccaneers ILB **Kevin Minter** and Bears OLB **Barkevious Mingo** spent four seasons together in Baton Rouge, with both players leaving LSU early to enter the 2013 NFL Draft. The tandem played a key role in a Tiger defense that helped LSU to a 10-3 record in 2012 and a No. 14 finish in the AP Poll. Minter was named the team's MVP in their final collegiate season while Mingo was a second-team All-SEC selection. The two were also members of the 2011 LSU squad that advanced to the BCS Championship game against the Alabama Crimson Tide. In their collegiate careers, Minter and Mingo posted an overall record of 43-10.

FORMER BUCCANEERS

- Bears ILB Devante Bond played for the Buccaneers from 2017-19.
- Bears K Cairo Santos played in seven games for the Buccaneers during the 2018 season, converting on 9-of-12 field goal attempts for Tampa.
- Bears Assistant Offensive Line Coach Donovan Raiola played offensive line for the Buccaneers in 2010.
- Bears Wide Receivers Assistant/Offensive Quality Control Coach Chris Jackson spent part of the 1998 season with the Buccaneers as an undrafted free agent.

FORMER BEARS

- Buccaneers Special Teams Coordinator Keith Armstrong held the same position in Chicago from 1997-2000.
- Buccaneers Specialists Coach Chris Boniol kicked for the Bears in 1999.
- Buccaneers Inside Linebackers Coach Mike Caldwell played linebacker for the Bears in 2002.

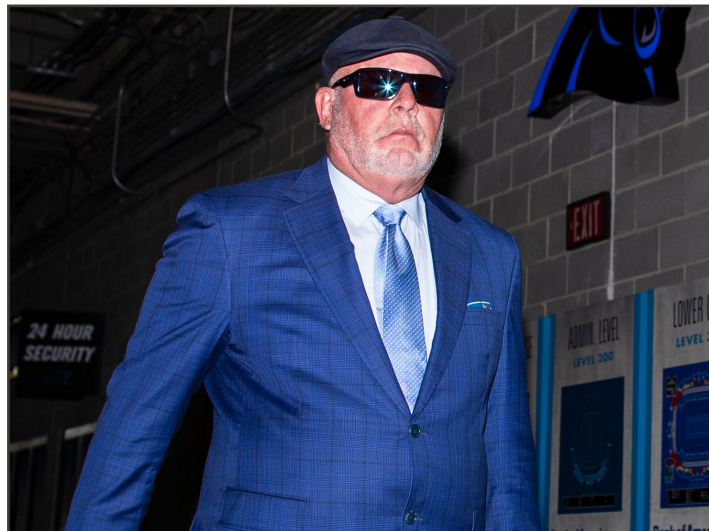


CONNECTIONS

PLAYER/COACH CONNECTIONS

- Bears RT Bobby Massie is familiar with the Tampa Bay offensive scheme, as the ninth-year lineman spent three seasons playing for Buccaneers Head Coach Bruce Arians and various members of the Tampa Bay coaching staff when the group was in Arizona. Massie was a stalwart of the offensive line for Arians, starting in 30 of the 38 games he played under Arians' guidance. The 2014 campaign saw Massie start in all 16 regular season games, one of only three times he has done so in his NFL career.
- When Buccaneers Defensive Coordinator Todd Bowles was the head coach of the New York Jets, a current Bears cornerback was a key cog in his defensive unit. Bears CB Buster Skrine played for Bowles in all four seasons Bowles was at the helm in New York, appearing in 59 games (48 starts). Over that span, Skrine recorded three interceptions and his third-best single-season tackle output of his career in 2017 (63) while playing a part in New York's third-ranked defense in Bowles' first season (2015).
- Buccaneers OLB Shaquil Barrett entered the NFL in 2014 when he was signed by the Denver Broncos as an undrafted free agent. Despite not appearing in a game during his first professional season, Barrett spent the year learning from Bears Defensive Line Coach Jay Rodgers, who held the same position in Denver through the 2014 season before leaving for Chicago.
- Buccaneers RB Leonard Fournette spent the 2019 campaign with the Jacksonville Jaguars, working under Bears Quarterbacks Coach John DeFillippo, who was the offensive coordinator in Jacksonville for the 2019 season. Under DeFillippo, Fournette posted his third consecutive 1,000-yard rushing season, to go along with 522 receiving yards and three rushing touchdowns.
- Buccaneers C Ryan Jensen broke into the NFL with the Baltimore Ravens in 2014, spending four seasons with the organization before joining the Buccaneers. His first offensive line coach in the NFL was Juan Castillo, who now holds the same position in Chicago. Castillo and Jensen were three of Jensen's four seasons with the Ravens.
- Castillo also spent time with Buccaneers RB LeSean McCoy, serving as the Buffalo Bills Offensive Line Coach/Run Game coordinator from 2017-18 while McCoy played for Buffalo. While working with Castillo, McCoy produced a Pro Bowl season in 2017 with 1,138 rushing yards, six rushing touchdowns and two receiving touchdowns.

TURN BACK THE CLOCK



When Bears Defensive Coordinator **Chuck Pagano** was named head coach of the Indianapolis Colts in 2012, he tabbed Buccaneers Head Coach **Bruce Arians** as his offensive coordinator. Following Pagano's diagnosis with leukemia during the 2012 season, Arians served as the interim head coach in Indianapolis, leading the Colts to an 11-5 overall record that included nine wins under Arians' guidance. Arians received the Associated Press Coach of the Year honor following the season and was later hired as the head coach of the Arizona Cardinals.



Buccaneers Safeties Coach **Nick Rapone** and Bears Special Teams Assistant **Brian Ginn** will reunite on Thursday after spending a handful of years together in the college ranks. Rapone and Ginn coached together at the University of Delaware from 2006-12, playing a role in 50 wins over the seven-season span.



HC BRUCE ARIANS

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- X Arians is a two-time Associated Press NFL Coach of the Year, earning the award in 2012 (Indianapolis Colts) and in 2014 (Arizona Cardinals).
- X He is the only coach in NFL history to earn the award multiple times in a three-year span with different teams and is one of only 12 coaches in NFL history to win the award multiple times.
- X Prior to his time with the Colts, Arians spent eight seasons with the Steelers, five as offensive coordinator (2007-11) and three as the wide receivers coach (2004-06). During his tenure as the offensive coordinator, the Steelers had a 55-25 record, tying Green Bay for the second-best mark in the NFL during that span.
- X Pittsburgh won three AFC North Division titles, two AFC Championships and earned a victory in Super Bowl XLIII over the Cardinals. Arians was also part of the Steelers' Super Bowl XL win as the team's wide receivers coach.

ARIZONA CARDINALS

- X During his time in Arizona, Arians compiled a 49-30-1 regular season record (.619 winning percentage). The Cardinals' 49 wins during that span were the seventh-most in the NFL and the third-most in the NFC. Arians won 50 total games in Arizona (49 regular season, one postseason), finishing as the winningest coach in franchise history. His 49 regular season wins are also the most by any coach in Cardinals history.
- X In 2015, Arians led the Cardinals to a franchise record 13 wins, which also featured the team's first-ever postseason bye and second-ever appearance in the NFC Championship Game.
- X Under Arians, the Cardinals offense set several single-season team records, including points scored (489 in 2015), total touchdowns (59 in 2015), total net yards (6,533 in 2015) and first downs (373 in 2015).

TAMPA BAY BUCCANEERS

- X Bruce Arians was named the 12th head coach in franchise history on January 8, 2019.
- X In his first season with the Buccaneers in 2019, Arians led Tampa Bay to a two-win improvement over the previous season, guiding the team to a 5-3 record over the last eight games to finish 7-9. The team's seven wins were its most since 2016. In addition, the Buccaneers 5-3 record on the road matched the third-best road mark in team history.
- X Under Arians' direction, Tampa Bay's offense set franchise records for both points scored (458) and touchdowns (54), while leading the league in passing offense at 302.8 yards per game and ranking third in the NFL in total offense at 397.9 yards per game. On the defensive side of the ball, the Buccaneers boasted the NFL's best run defense, limiting opponents to 1,181 rushing yards over 16 games (73.8 avg.), the lowest total allowed in a 16-game season in franchise history.

INDIANAPOLIS COLTS

- X Arians went to Arizona after spending the 2012 season with Indianapolis. Hired as the team's offensive coordinator, he also served as the team's interim head coach for 12 games while head coach Chuck Pagano was treated for leukemia. He led the Colts to a 9-3 record and was selected as the 2012 AP NFL Coach of the Year. Indianapolis' nine-win improvement (2-14 to 11-5) matched the third-largest single-season turnaround in NFL history.
- X Arians helped the Colts' offense rank 10th in the NFL in yards (362.4 ypg) and seventh in passing yards (258.0 ypg). Rookie quarterback Andrew Luck - the first overall pick in the 2012 NFL Draft - made the Pro Bowl and set rookie records for passing yards (4,374) and 300-yard passing games (six). He also established the NFL single-game rookie record for passing yards (433, 11/4 vs. Miami). Luck finished with the then-third-most passing touchdowns by a rookie in NFL history, with 23.

MATT NAGY



Matt Nagy is in his third season with the Chicago Bears in 2020 after being named the 16th head coach in franchise history on January 8th, 2018.

Nagy, the 2018 Associated Press and PFWA Coach of the Year, has recorded 20 wins (20-12) in his first two seasons as the head coach in Chicago, surpassing George "Papa Bear" Halas (19, 1920-21) for the most wins by a Bears head coach in his first two seasons. Nagy also has enjoyed success within the division, going 9-3 against the NFC North.

The Bears finished the 2019 season 8-8 in a year that saw WR Allen Robinson II become the first 1,000-yard receiver for the Bears since 2014. The Bears also were a force on the defensive side of the ball once again under Nagy and first-year defensive coordinator Chuck Pagano, allowing 18.6 points per game, the fewest in the NFC and No. 4 overall in the NFL. Four players were named to the Pro Bowl following the season in LB Khalil Mack, DB Eddie Jackson, special teamer Cordarrelle Patterson and DB Kyle Fuller, bringing the total to 12 selections in his first two years as head coach.

Nagy orchestrated a remarkable turnaround for the Bears in his first year in 2018, taking a 5-11 team in 2017 and transforming them into NFC North champions, capturing AP and PFWA Coach of the Year honors for his efforts. The Bears, who won nine of their last 10 that season, finished the regular season 12-4, the most wins since the 2006 NFC Championship season (13-3), and the most by a Bears head coach in their inaugural season in franchise history. In doing so, Chicago secured the NFC's No. 3 seed and hosted a playoff game for the first time since the 2010 NFC Championship game.

Prior to arriving in Chicago, Nagy spent five seasons with the Kansas City Chiefs, working as the quarterbacks coach from 2013-15, as the co-offensive coordinator in 2016 and as the lone offensive coordinator in 2017.

In his five seasons with the Chiefs, Nagy worked closely with QB Alex Smith, who owned a 65.1 completion percentage in the five seasons working with Nagy, ranking first among all Chiefs QBs with at least 700 passing attempts.

Before joining the Chiefs coaching staff, Nagy spent three years on the offensive staff of the Philadelphia Eagles, serving two seasons as the franchise's offensive quality control coach (2011-12). He was promoted to that role after he served as a coaching assistant during the 2010 campaign. His initial experience with the Eagles came in 2008 and 2009 when he served as a coaching intern during Eagles training camp.

A former quarterback for the Arena Football League, Nagy played six seasons, completing 65.5 percent of his passes for 18,866 yards, 374 touchdowns and a quarterback rating of 115.1. Nagy played collegiately at Delaware, setting more than 20 career passing records at the time, including career marks for passing yards (8,214) and touchdowns (58). Nagy earned All-America honors as a senior for the Blue Hens after setting single-season records in attempts (379), yards (3,436) and touchdowns (29).

After graduating from Delaware with a degree in health and physical education, Nagy gained coaching experience at several local high schools, as he served as an assistant coach at Manheim Central (2001), the quarterbacks coach at Cedar Crest (2002-03) and the offensive coordinator at Palmyra Area High School (2008-09).

He and his wife, Stacey, have four sons: Brayden, Tate, Jaxon and Jett.
